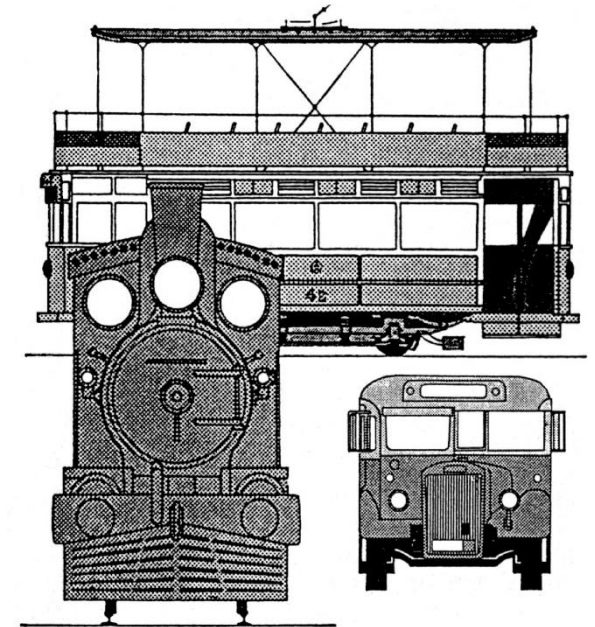

## SOCIETY AIMS

Founded in 1962, the Tasmanian Transport Museum Society has two main aims:

- ◆ to establish and maintain a Museum in which items of interest concerning Tasmanian transport will be preserved and displayed
- ◆ to further interest and research into transport, with particular reference to Tasmania

## MUSEUM HISTORY

The Museum was opened on 3 December 1983.

Development has included the laying of rail track and the erection of buildings in which the collection is housed. The former New Town railway station has been relocated at the Museum, providing an authentic setting for the display and operation of rail vehicles.

The museum contains locomotives, rail cars, carriages, trains, trolley buses, motor buses, stationary steam engines and many other items of historical and educational interest. There is an operational vintage train. Most exhibits are restored to varying condition, but several are awaiting future restoration.

## MEMBER ACTIVITIES

Meetings are held on the third Thursday of February, May, September and November at the Transport Museum at 7.30 PM where, apart from discussion of Society business, talks, films, slides and recordings of transport topics are a regular feature.

A newsletter is distributed regularly to members via email.

The assistance of members in restoring and maintaining vehicles and other exhibits, keeping the site well-presented and staffing the Museum at weekends and special occasions is greatly valued.

The Society welcomes the gift or loan of relics associated with Tasmania's transport history for display at the Museum.
